HEALTHCARE: A GROWING INDUSTRY

The BLS reports that the need for RNs is expected to expand to 3.4 million in 2028.

The healthcare industry has experienced significant growth in areas throughout the United States in recent years.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), 18 of the 30 fastest growing job markets in the United States are in healthcare and related occupations, such as nursing. Some of the most sought-after nursing jobs include Registered Nurse (RN), Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN), Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) and Certified Medical Technician. The BLS reports that the need for RNs is expected to expand to 3.4 million in 2028, a 12% increase from 2018. Similarly, the need for LPNs is projected to grow by 11% and the need for nursing assistants by 9%, over the same period. In Pittsburgh, where healthcare has emerged as one of the city's most robust and fastest growing industries, nursing has been and continues to be a booming career field, and it is expected to remain so for the foreseeable future. That makes getting a job in nursing one of the best career choices for individuals who have an interest in working in Pittsburgh's healthcare field.

The demand for nurse jobs nationwide is at an all-time high and Pittsburgh in particular has seen a nursing boom that promises to remain steady for years to come.



According to the BLS, the employment of Registered Nurses (RNs) is expected to grow 12% between 2018 and 2028, a rate that is much faster than the average for all other occupations. This is due at least in part to the increasing prevalence of chronic medical conditions and a growing demand for healthcare services from aging baby boomers who are living longer and more active lives. There is also a pressing need to replace the baby boomer nurses who are now retiring in droves. According to estimates from the BLS, there will be roughly 1.1 million job openings in the nursing field by 2024.
